Over the next 10 years both Claude and Nathan continued to work in breweries, developing their skills and furthering their love of a good craft brew. Slowly, the friends began dreaming of what they would create. Dreams became strategies, strategies became legitimate plans and in 2012 the bottles aligned and Double Trouble Brewing Co. was launched.

From there the duo began drinking with a sense of purpose – they had to unlock the right tastings and refinements, working to create something special. The company's flagship brew, Hops and Robbers, launched in Feb 2013. This same care goes into the development of every brand Double Trouble Brewing Co. introduces.

Claude and Nathan set out to create small batch craft beer they love. Something well suited to all Canadians, Double Trouble Brewing Co. beers are enjoyed by craft brew enthusiasts and everyday beer drinkers alike. Double Trouble Brewing Co. beers were created to be sessionable, flavour packed brews that awaken the senses of beer drinkers everywhere. Complex and fun, just like Claude and Nathan.

The key to pint after pint of goodness? Claude and Nathan keep it simple. They started from the bottom with no investors, scraping together what they could in order to hold true to their commitment to well-made craft beer for the sake of a good drink. Taking a chance to do what you love and believe in is the core of Double Trouble Brewing Co. It's how everything good starts. These guys don't want to make a fortune, they want people to enjoy a delicious beer that tastes like love when it flows down your gullet.

Tasting notes: This golden IPA features exceptionally rich, complex character. Fruity aromas of lemon with hints of pineapple combine crisply with toasty caramel flavours and a tasty malt backbone. Dry hopping with cascade hops ensures more hop aromatics are retained in the finished beer. Golden in hue.

FIRE IN THE RYE ROASTED RYE PALE ALE




Double Trouble Brewing Co. works with Margaret Hanson Design Co. to create the artwork for the packaging of all their brews

The can designs are bright and dynamic action scenes showing the cat burglars robbing hops, escaping the confines of prison to make Prison Break, rescuing rye for Fire in the Rye, mirroring the dark, mysterious gaze of Claude on French Press, and plotting humorous revenge on Revenge of the Ginger. On Grow a Pear, the can design is a little different with the robbers blending into the background pattern, the show stealer is the pears. That is, until you notice the robbers.


